### Five Profess First Vows in Franciscan Order

### Friars on Pilgrimage

June 15, 2009 at Cedar Lake, IN our five novices, along with one each from Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and Sacred Heart Provinces, professed vows for the first time thereby ending their novitiate and becoming Temporary Professed Friars in the Order of Friars Minor. The newly professed will move to Chicago, IL this fall to our inter-provincial friary where they will pursue studies and continue

their formation as Franciscans. This summer, Friars Galen, Martin, Daniel and Tim will study at St. Bonaventure University in New York while Roger, Joshua and Clifford will join Friar Richard Goodin and Frs. Mark Soehner (SJB) and Ed Shea (SH) on pilgrimage in Virginia (see accompanying story on right).



June 16, 2009 at St. Anthony Friary, Cincinnati, OH six Friars were prayed over as they prepared to begin a six-week, 300-mile pilgrimage from Roanoke, VA to Washington, DC. Planning to take little on the road, the group plans to find work for food and shelter as they witness to their faith to whomever they meet.

The six pilgrims are (l to r) newly professed Friars Roger Lopez and Joshua van Cleef; Fr. Ed Shea a member of the formation team at the interprovincial formation house in Chicago; newly professed Friar Clifford Hennings; Fr. Mark Soehner, also a team member in Chicago; and Friar Richard Goodin, a second year Temporary Professed. All are members of St. John the Baptist Province except Fr. Ed who belongs to Sacred Heart.

During the ceremony, each Friar places his hands into those of the representative of the province and read the vow formula in which he promised to follow the Rule of Saint Francis according to our General Constitutions living in obedience, without anything of his own, and in chastity. Since all of the Provincial Ministers of the Order were in Assisi for a General Chapter, the Provincial Vicars represented the Provinces.

As novices, the Friars wore a cord without knots.

As a part of the profession ceremony they are clothed with a cord with three knots representing the vows they had just taken.

Each Friar vowed the Franciscan life for one year. By Church law they must make a one-year profession for a minimum of three years before being allowed to make a life-time commitment of Solemn Vows.


## Two men received into the Novitiate at Cedar lake, IN

June and early July are exciting months for me as a Vocation Director. Early in June the Postulants wrap up their year of Postulancy and leave for a few-week vacation prior

to entering the Novitiate on June 24th. On June 15th the Novices conclude their stage of formation by making their First Profession of Vows. Then on July 1st, the new Postulants arrive to begin their initial year of formation.

While no one was prepared to make a Solemn Profession (a life-long commitment) this year, the fact that we have eleven men in Initial Formation is exciting. The Lord is richly blessing our community and the long hours of Vocation Ministry are showing some positive results. I cannot help but feel a certain sense of satisfaction, but I also experience a deep sense of gratitude to our loving God for allowing me to be a part of these men's discernment process.

But the story doesn't end there. A new group is already preparing themselves to begin their Franciscan formation next July 1st as the Postulants of 2010. ## Three formally Received Into the Postulancy Program

Our new Postulants were formally received into the Postulancy Program by Fr. Jeffrey Scheeler, O.F.M., our Provincial Minister, at an Evening Prayer Service at St. Anthony Friary in Cincinnati on Tuesday, July 7, 2009. Each was invested with a Tau Cross, a traditional symbol used by Saint Francis. These men will live with the Friars until the beginning of next June learning about Franciscan life, communal living and prayer, and Franciscan spirituality. But most of all,

they will learn about themselves and about their vocation. This is an initial step in the discernment process which, God willing, will lead them to give their lives to the Lord and to the Church as Franciscans in Solemn (life-long) Profession of vows.
